

BARTON SCHOOL

The Barton School is a large two and a half story, five bay wide, rectangular building constructed of brick laid in American Common Bond. The school was constructed in the 1890's from the general development and growth of the town. Upgrading of free school curriculums came in the 1890's in Allegany County, when institutions began to give first preference to teachers with professional training.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Barton Elementary School is located at the corner of Latrobe and Washington Street in Barton, Allegany County.

The Barton School is a large two and a half story, five bay wide, rectangular building that is constructed of brick laid in American Common Bond with five to one variation. The building rests on a high stone foundation with a beveled water table. The roof is gabled and is covered with tin. Cross gables are located on the main and east facades. Round arched windows are located in both cross gables. A small dormer window also interrupts the roofline on the eastern facade. The walls of the school are plain with the exception of a continuous sill which runs beneath the first and second story windows. Windows on the first floor are double hung wooden sash frames with four over four lights and jack arches, while those on the second floor are similar except that they are round arched windows with semi-circular arches. The main entrance is located on the southeast facade and features a replaced door with a wide transom which is located in a recessed entrance way which is covered by an elaborate semi-circular archway. A three story tower topped by an ogee roof is located on the southern facade. A massive corbeled brick chimney is located in the interior of the building.

The school is in fair condition; however, it is no longer use and its condition is beginning to deteriorate.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Barton School was constructed in the 1890's from the general growth and development of the town of Barton. In years prior to 1870 nearly half of the county's schools were log structures, and the schools were largely centralized. In 1969 a new state law providing for decentralized education authority went into effect. However, insufficient financial support hurt the system and it was not until the late nineteenth century that the George's Creek Region began an extensive building campaign. ¹ "Upgrading of the free schools curriculums came in the 1890's, when institutions began to give first preference to teachers with professional training." ² The Barton School was built during this period and a rear addition was later added. The school served to enhance the educational progress of the county in the late nineteenth century.






