DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Shaw Frame House is located on German Street in Barton, Allegany County.

The Shaw House is a two story, three bay wide, rectangular building that was originally covered with weatherboard but has since been covered with aluminum siding. A small, frame, shed roof addition abuts the main block on the western side. The entire building rests on a low stone foundation. The roof is gabled with a boxed cornice and returns and is covered with tin. Windows in the building are double hung wooden sash frames with plain trim and two over two lights. Those on the main facade have louvered shutters. The main entrance is located on the east side and features a replaced door and hardware. A three bay hipped roof end porch is also located at the east side of the building. Two original brick chimneys are located in the interior of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Shaw Frame House is one of the original buildings constructed on what is known as Dutch Row in the town of Barton. The town of Barton was laid out in 1853 by William Shaw Jr. and the houses on Dutch Row were among the first to be constructed. The street is appropriately named in that in the beginning it was largely inhabited by German immigrants.

The Shaw Frame House was originally a small one and a half story saltbox, typical of the type of miner's housing constructed in the George's Creek Valley. It was enlarged significantly in the present century.





Sanborn Map, 1921-1936


