The German Lutheran Church consists of a one story, two bay wide, rectangular shaped frame facade. The church was built in 1871 by the trustees for the small German Evangelical congregation. The original sixteen families comprising the congregation were predominately German immigrants as is evidenced by the trustee names: Tribut, Miller and Creutzburg.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The German Lutheran Church is located just west of German Street in Barton, Allegany County.

The German Lutheran Church is a one story, two bay wide, rectangular frame structure that is covered with a combination of clapboard and novelty and board and batten siding. The building rests on a high stone foundation and has a gable roof that has been covered with tin. Windows in the structure are double hung wooden sash frames with plain trim and twelve over twelve lights. Verticle board shutters originally flanked all the windows. The main entrance is located on the south facade and features a single leaf vertically paneled door with original hardware. The door opens into an enclosed shed roofed entrance porch which has a single sash six light window on its southern side. An original brick chimney is located in the inside end of the building.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

On February 1, 1867 the Trustee for the German Evangelical Lutheran Church purchased land from William Shaw, one of the founders of Barton. Once the land was obtained from Shaw, a one room meeting house was constructed west of "Dutch Row" in Barton. The original 16 families comprising the congregation were predominantly German immigrants as is evidenced by the names of the original trustees: August Tribut, Christopher Gottlieb Miller and Valentine Creutburg. The church continued to use the building until the 1920's when a new church was constructed. At that time the original was sold to the United Mine Workers who used it as a meeting room.








WESTERNPORT 1.2 MI.

● = SITE LOCATION




