The Old Morrison Log House consists of a two and one half story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped log structure. The house is believed to have been built by James Morrison, son to the original settler and planner of the Town of Westernport, at the beginning of the 19th century. All the land, including the Town of Westernport and its contiguous territory was originally owned by James Morrison, Sr. and Adam Sigler.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Hardman Log House is located on the west side of Hill Run Road in the vicinity of Barton, Allegany County near the intersection of Hill Run Road.

The house basically consists of a two and one half story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped log structure. A one story frame wing abuts the main block on the rear western side forming a "L" shaped structure. The main block is constructed by logs with "V" notching and replaced concrete chinking and is supported by a low stone foundation. The roof of the structure is gabled and covered with replaced asphalt shingles, while the eaves include boxed cornices. Windows in the structure include replaced, double hung wooden sash frames with one-over-one lights and replaced single sash frame with fixed lights. Original double hung wooden sash pegged frames with six-over-six lights are also found on the structure. Entrances to the structure are all replaced verticle paneled doors with plain trim. The main entrance is on the front eastern side and is covered by a three bay end porch with shed roof. The porch roof includes boxed cornices and entablature supported by wrought iron columns. Two chimneys are found within the main block; one being a replaced cement block, the other an original corbeled stone chimney located on the inside end.

The building is structually sound however it has somewhat altered since original construction.

SPECIFIC DATES**BUILDER/ARCHITECT****STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The old Morrison Log House is believed to have been built circa 1845 by James Morrison.¹ This statement is based upon the title search which traced to a will from James Morrison to Mary E. Shultice on October 1, 1892. It is also concluded that James Morrison was the son of James Morrison Sr. who originally laid out the town of Westernport at the beginning of the nineteenth century.² All the land, including the town of Westernport and its contiguous territory, was originally owned by James Morrison and Adam Sigler.³ The house itself is a very large and sturdy log structure with "V" notching. In early settlement period of the county, timber for logs was one of the most readily available materials for construction. The house although somewhat altered remains an architectural reminder of a way of life once found in Allegany County.


