Although this house was owned during most of the twentieth century by the Campbell Coal Company, it was probably built during the latter half of the nineteenth century by a relatively prosperous family. The Campbell Coal Company, which mined the Barton area, was formed by George D. and Thomas D. Campbell at the turn of the century. The house was never occupied by members of the Campbell family but was probably rented to an employee of the coal company.

The "L" shaped two story frame building includes details which suggest that the original owners were more prosperous than average residents of the mining area. These include transomed entrances and tall windows which are pedimented and have fluted jambs, capped cornerboards, and decoratively turned porch posts. The building has been vacant for many years and could deteriorate rapidly without proper care.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building in original condition, consists of an "L" shaped, two story, four bays wide frame structure with german siding. It rests on a high stone foundation of coursed rubble with a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with tar paper. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bedmould, and frieze with returns. Wall features include capped cornerboards. Two brick chimneys are located inside end an on the interior.

Two pedimented entrances located in the corner of the "L" shaped building, each includes a one light transom and a five panel door with original hardware. Windows are pedimented, tall, pegged two over two lights with fluted jambs and wooden lugsills. A porch at the corner of the "L", mostly on the southeastern facade, has a shed roof supported by decoratively lathed posts. A shed roofed porch is on the northeast.


