

Patterson Frame House
AL-V1-C-183

This residence was built circa 1889 on lot #79 of the village of Moscow. The house was occupied in 1890 by the Patterson Family. The "L" shaped frame house with german siding is in excellent condition. Of particular interest are the decorative eaves which consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, frieze returns, and scrolled brackets in pairs. A porch on the western facade includes bargeboard in a small central gable, turned posts, and scrollwork bracketing, the gingerbread woodwork of Victorian Gothic architecture.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Patterson Frame House is located on Ninth Street in the village of Moscow.

This "L" shaped house is two stories tall and three bays wide. Wall construction is frame with german siding. The building rests on a low stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with ribbed tin. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, frieze return, and decoratively scrolled brackets in pairs. An original brick chimney with a corbeled cap is located in the center of the building. The "L" wing has an umbrage porch on the south. A small one story frame addition on the east has a gabled roof.

A pedimented entrance in the center of the western facade includes a two light transom and a nine light door with original hardware. Windows with decorative pediments are pegged two over two light sashes with wooden lugsills. Wall features include capped cornerboards. A porch on the western facade covered with ribbed tin has a hipped roof with a central gable featuring a decorative circular ventilator and bargebaord. The roof is supported by turned posts with floral scrollwork brackets and pendants. The porch has a decorative splat board railing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The village of Moscow in the George's Creek mining region was "laid out" by A.B. Shaw on his family's estate in the late 1860's. (1) Instead of creating a completely company-owned town similar to others of the area, Shaw reserved much of the planned town for private individuals. (2)

This residence was built circa 1889 on lot#79 of the village. A 1890 plat of the town shows that the lot was occupied by the Patterson Family. (3) The "L" shaped frame house with german siding is in excellent condition. Of particular interest are the decorative eaves which consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, bed mould, frieze returns, and scrolled brackets in pairs. A porch on the western facade includes bargeboard in a small central gable, turned posts, and scrollwork bracketing the gingerbread woodwork of Victorian Gothic architecture. The Patterson Frame House stands as physical evidence of the cultural awareness of late nineteenth century residents of small mining villages in Western Allegany County.


