DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Charles Morgan House is located on the northeastern side of Laurel Run Road one-half of one mile northwest of Moscow. The frame "L" shaped house is two stories tall, three bays wide on the facade (southwestern elevation), and one bay deep.

The frame walls of the house are covered with weatherboards and asbestos shingles. The building rests on a cinderblock foundation. The gabled roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

A porch on the facade has a hipped roof supported by turned wooden posts. A hip-roofed porch on the northeastern elevation has metal posts. Windows are 1/1 sash with a simple drip moulding. An entrance in the center of the facade has an enclosed transom and a nine light frame and glass door. An exterior cinderblock chimney is located on the northwestern elevation.


