DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame farmhouse is situated in a hilly semi-wooded area on Kyle Hill Road, approximately one mile northeast of Aron Run Road. The house faces north. It is a two story, three bay by one bay gable roof structure with a one bay by one bay, two story wing which extends the length of the west elevation. The house also has a single bay deep, plank constructed ell. A single story shed addition is located at the east elevation of the ell. A partially enclosed porch runs along the length of both the rear, south, elevation of the main block and the west elevation of the ell. A wooden porch supported by plain square posts is located along the facade and the east elevation of the main block. The house is entered from the central facade entrance, an entrance at the shed addition of the ell and at the rear porch.

Exterior cinderblock chimneys are located, one on the facade and one at the gable end of the ell. An interior brick chimney is located at the southwest corner of the wing. One over one sash windows with plain surrounds light the second story with two over two sash windows in the first story. The cellar is entered from the facade of the wing. The house rests on a stone foundation. Weatherboard siding framed with cornerboards covers the exterior. Tar paper covers the roof.

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Allegany County from the late nineteenth century through the early twentieth century.


