DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area on Mill Run. Rd. approximately one mile northeast of Aron Run Rd. The house faces west. It is a two story, three bay by one bay gable roof structure with a two bay wide ell. A wooden porch supported by turned posts extends the length of the facade. A wooden porch supported by plain square posts is located across the rear, east elevation of the ell. The facade entrance is located to the south end. The house can also be entered from the rear ell porch.

The house has a central brick chimney located at the point where the ell meets the main block. One over one sash windows, with drip cap molding, light the house. The house rests on a stone foundation. "Brick" asphalt shingles cover the original german siding. Tar paper covers the roof.


