The St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church consists of a single story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped facade. The church was built in 1871 and replaced an old ramshackle building that was originally used as the place of worship. This first church building was purchased in 1854 and by 1868, the congregation had grown large enough to merit construction of the permanent present church.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church is located on Church Street in Westernport, Allegany County.

St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church is a single, three bay wide, rectangular building. The building was originally constructed of brick laid in American Common Bond but has since been covered with stucco. It is designed around an apsidal plan and rests on a high cut stone foundation with a beveled water table. The roof is gabled with pedimented cornice and is covered with replaced asphalt shingles. An extension tower is located on the south facade. Windows in the structure are stained glass lights that are pilastered and arcaded. A belt course is located in the central tower and features a vertically paneled door with a large fanlight. The door was originally flanked by two pilasters and topped by a pediment. However, today it is covered by a one bay gable-roofed entrance porch. The tower has two small arcaded and pilastered windows on its southern facade. Originally it was topped by a louvered belfry and a spire. The spire has since been removed and louvered belfry now features a single gothic style louvered windows on each of its four sides. Each window has a hoodmould with a keystone and is flanked by two battlements which alternate with four peaked parapets. The church originally had four corbeled brick chimneys located in the interior of the building. At present a single stucco covered chimney is left.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

As early as 1849 Catholic Redemptorist priests from Cumberland had begun to minister to the population in and around the town of Westernport. The influx of Irish and Italian miners to the Westernport area prompted Father Michael Slattery, pastor from Frostburg, to begin making regular trips to Westernport. By 1854 his congregation had purchased land and a ramshackle building which they planned to use as a church. Eventually this original building was enlarged to accomodate the growing congregation and was known as Father Slattery's Cathedral. After one unsuccessful land pruchase, Father Slattery bought land on the Maryland side of the Potomac in Westernport. On this property Father Slattery built the first Catholic Chruch in Westernport. In years later, this original frame structure was converted to St. Peter's School. By 1868 the congregation had grown large enough to merit the construction of a permanent building. Ground was broken for the building on August 9, 1870 and the cornerstone was laid on April 16, 1871. The new church, including the pews and altars, one of which was constructed of green marble imported from Ireland, was \$25,000.00.

St. Peter's Church, along with its convent and school have served the community of Westernport for over 100 years. The church building itself remained essentially unchanged until 1921 when the church underwent a significant amount of re-decorating.




