

GREEN COLONIAL REVIVAL HOUSE

119 Wood Street, Westernport
ca. 1900

The Green Colonial Revival House basically consists of a two and a half story, three bay wide, rectangular shaped, brick structure laid in American Common Bond. At the time of its construction, ca. 1900, the house would have been an extremely fashionable residence in the Town of Westernport. The Colonial Revival style did not become popular until the 1890's and even then, it would have taken some time to reach this western area of the State.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Green Colonial Revival House is located at 119 Wood Street in Westernport, Allegany County.

The Green Colonial Revival House is a two and a half story, three bay wide, rectangular building that is constructed of brick laid in stretcher bond. The building rests on a low concrete foundation with a beveled water table. The roof is hipped and has been covered with replaced asphalt shingles. It has a boxed cornice and a dentilated entablature. Gable roofed dormers interrupt the roof line on all four sides of the house. Each has a dentilated entablature and three windows with double hung, wooden sash frames and three over one lights. Each window is flanked by a pilaster topped with an ionic capital. Beneath the central dormer window is a two story bay window. The second story bay consists of two eighteen light casements which in turn are flanked by two side lights and two more pilasters with ionic capitals. All the pilasters support a dentilated entablature. The entire window is topped by a leaded glass fanlight with fluted trim and a semi-circular arch. The first story bay serves as a main entrance and features double leaf, single panel doors which are flanked by pilasters with ionic capitals and recessed, paneled sidelights. The entire entrance way is topped by a leaded glass fanlight with fluted trim. The remaining windows are double hung, wooden sash frames with one over one lights. A shed roofed wrap-around porch extends from the west to the east facade. The porch has a dentilated entablature and is supported by ionic columns. At the rear of the building the porch is somewhat plainer. It is supported by Roman Doric columns and turned ballustrade. Two corbeled brick chimneys are located in the interior of the building.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Green House is one of a small group of Colonial Revival style homes found in the town of Westernport. The house is believed to have been built ca. 1900 probably for a wealthy executive of Luke Hill, the largest industry in the Westernport area. At the time of its construction the house would have been an extremely fashionable residence. The Colonial Revival style did not become popular until the 1890's and even then it would have taken sometime to spread from the urban centers of the east to a mountain backwater like Westernport. Thus, the original owner must have been very conscious of changes in architectural fashion. The style, is easily indentified by such hallmarks as the Palladian windows or in the case of the Green House fanlights, ionic colums and dentilated entabtures. With the event of the Colonial Revival style, the variety and plasticity of the Queen Anne Style gave way to massive solid structures and a penchant for historical detail.






