This residence on Church Street of Westernport was built in Gannon's Addition to the town around 1911. The original owner was John M. David who sold the house to his brother-in-law Norris Bruce in 1921. Davis' wife Edna and Norris Bruce were children of Oliver H. Bruce one of the most respected educators of Allegany County.

The square wooden building was designed with the Georgian Revival symmetry and detail popular early in the twentieth century. The columned front porch and large dormers are examples of the exaggerated design of the style. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, and frieze with modillions and dentils.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The **Norris** Bruce House is located at 163 Church Street in Westernport.

The building, in original condition, consists of a square two and one-half story, three bays wide frame structure covered with asbestos shingles. It rests on a high foundation of poured cement with a plain water table. The pyramidal hip roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Eaves consist of boxed cornice,soffit, and frieze with plain modillions and dentils. Four hip roofed dormers, each with two windows, have eaves consisting of a boxed cornice, soffit and frieze with dentils. Wall features include a three sided bay window with a flat roof on the northwest. One of the three windows is stained glass. Two original multiple flue brick chimneys, one inside end and the other on the interior, have corbeled caps.

The main entrance, in the center of the southwestern facade, includes a one light transom and one light sidelights. The door is of one large beveled glass light and original hardware. An entrance in the center of the southwestern second floor leads to a balcony. Large double windows on the first floor of the southwestern facade are pedimented and pegged one over one lights with wooden slipsills. Other windows are pegged one over one lights, some in pairs. Double and single casement windows are on the northwest and southeast and in the dormers. The front porch, supported by a stone foundation, has a flat roof supported by wooden Roman doric columns. A projection over the stairway is supported by a pair of columns. Eaves of the porch roof are the same as those of the building. A two tiered porch with a shed roof and a small two story shed roofed addition are on the southeast.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This residence was constructed circa 1911 in Gannon's Addition to the town of Westport. The original owner was John M. Davis who sold the house in 1921 to his brother-in-law, Norris Bruce.(1) Davis' wife Edna and Norris Bruce were children of Oliver H. Bruce, "one of the most thorough and successful educators" of Allegany County, for whom Bruce High School was named. (2) Bruce's family owned the house until 1975.(3)

The square wooden building was designed with the Georgian Revival symmetry and detail popular early in the twentieth century. The columned front porch, with full eaves and a small balcony, and four large dormers are examples of the exaggerated design of the style. Eaves consist of a boxed cornice, soffit, and frieze with modillions and dentils.
