DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area on Stoney Run Road approximately 1/2 mile from Route 36. The house faces southwest. It is a two story, three bay gable roof structure with a single bay deep ell. A wooden porch supported by turned posts covers the facade bays. A two tiered wooden porch supported by turned posts (with balustrades on the second tier) is located at the southeast elevation of the ell. A single story one bay square addition is located at the northeast, rear, elevation of the house under the first tier of the two tier porch. The house has a central facade entrance.

The house has a central chimney. Two over two sash windows light the house. A large picture window has been put in the first story of the southeast elevation at the south end. The house rests on a high stone foundation. Asbestos shingles cover the original german siding.

A coal mine is located on the property.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Allegany County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The house was built circa 1920 by Charles Clark of Clark Coal Company. Clark operated a mine employing thirteen men around 1948.


