1888

Built in 1888, the house was constructed for Dr. Edward M. Walters who acquired the property from Thomas E. Mc Coole. The house is a two and one half story, three bay wide brick structure supported by a stone foundation. The building has very plain appointments other than the fish scale shingle trim on the ends of the gabled roof. The residence includes double hung wooden sash frame windows with four - over -four lights and a replaced entrance on the southwest side.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Walters old brick house is located at one Queen Street, McCoole, Allegany County on the north side of the road at the intersection of Main Street.

The house consists of a two and one half story, three bay wide "L" shaped main facade. A one story rear wing abuts the main block on the northeastern side and features a partial gable roof and shed roof combined. The building is a brick structure laid in American common bond construction and is supported by a low stone foundation with a beveled water table. The roof of the residence is gabled including soffit and frieze and is covered with replaced asphalt shingles. The gable ends of the roof feature wooden shingle trim and in two of the gables are found pointed arch, stain glass windows with architrave trim. Windows in the building include double hung wooden sash frames with four-over-four lights and plain trim. The main entrance is located on the front southwestern face and exhibits the original double doors with transom and transom lights. A small platform porch leads to the main entrance and is banistered with iron rod railing and has no hood. One corbeled brick chimney, which is original, is located centrally to the rear wing forming the "L" of the facade.

An outbuilding, constructed of brick and covered with a hipped tin roof, is found to the rear of the main structure and apparently was used as a vegetable cellar as evidenced by the bulkhead entrance.

The house is structurally very sound and retains most of its original fabric and appearance other than the replaced portions.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Rice House was built by a local doctor, Edward M. Walters, in McCooles in approximately 1888. The land on which the house was erected was acquired from the McCooles family. The house is a substantial one, unusual for the time and the area in that it is constructed of brick rather than frame with weatherboarding of some sort.

How many? Curved.

If not in hall, where is stair?

2. Wall finish: plaster, paneled, board partition

Note presence of chair rail, cornice, etc.

3. Fireplaces: How many? Parallel to walls or diagonal in corner?

Mantels: wood--mouldings, pilasters, columns
masonry--marble(what color?), brick

3. Doors: on the inside of exterior doors, note the presence of applied flush boards and their direction (diagonal, vertical, horizontal). In general are doors paneled or ledge or other?

4. Door and window trim: plain, architrave; fluted, reeded; pilasters

5. Kitchen: Where is original if extant or known (marked by very large fireplace)? Separate building; wing to principal dwelling; within principal dwelling? On which floor of any of the above?
