This house constructed in the late nineteenth century was built simply for the purpose of a permanent residence for Mr. Reese. The house is a two story, three bay wide frame structure which is supported by a low cut stone foundation. The house is covered by German siding and is capped by a hipped roof with soffit. Appointments of the house include front, three sectional, two story bay windows and regular one-over-one light windows with a wooden cornice. A rear wing with flat roof has been added to the structure for the purpose of an additional family residence.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Miller frame house is located at 184 Queen Street in McCoolle, Allegany County on the northeast side of the street at the intersection of Route 135 East.

The residence consists of a two story, three bay wide, square shaped main facade. A two story wing abuts the main facade on the rear northeastern side and exhibits a flat roof. The building is a frame structure which is covered with German siding and is supported by a low stone foundation with a plain water table. The roof of the structure is hipped including a soffit and is covered by replaced asphalt shingles. Windows in the building include double hung wooden sash frames with one-over-one lights, wooden cornice and architrave trim. On the front southwestern face is placed a two story, three sectional bay window which is capped by a cross-gable dormer roof. The main entrance is also located on the front face and features a replaced verticle paneled door with plain trim. Two chimneys are found on the facade, one is a new cement block chimney located on the outside end of the rear wing; the other is an original corbeled brick chimney located to the interior of the main facade.

The house is structurally very sound, however it has been somewhat altered with the addition of the rear wing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Reese House is typical of late 19th century frame farmhouses in Allegany County. There is some doubt as to whether the main facade retains its original appearance since the arrangement of the windows is extremely assymetrical. Nevertheless, this may be indicative of the whims of a country architect/builder and thus makes the building interesting simply because it deviates from the norm.
