DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Dayton Frame House is located near McCooles, in Queens Point.

The rectangular frame building is one and one-half stories tall and three bays wide. Wall construction is frame covered with insul brick siding. It rests on a high stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. The gable flank roof is covered with aluminum. Eaves consist of a simple overhang. An original brick chimney is located in the center of the building.

The main entrance offset on the southern facade includes a replaced plywood door. Windows are nailed one over one light and two over two light sashes. A replaced gabled roofed porch is on the south. A small gabled frame addition is on the north.

The Dayton Frame House is located in Queen's Point, a short distance from McCoolle. Roland S. Dayton owned a large amount of land in the area from 1853 to 1900.(1) Sometime in the last quarter of the nineteenth century he built this house. His daughter Charlotte and her husband Roger Moomau lived in the house in 1896.(2) When Dayton died in 1900 he left the house and two acres of land to Charlotte. (3)

This rectangular frame building is one and one-half stories tall and three bays wide. Wall construction is frame covered with insul brick siding. It rests on a high stone foundation of random rubble with a plain water table. An original brick chimney is located in the center of the building.


