<small>DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE</small>	
<p>The house is located at 69 West Main Street on the northerly side of the street between Bealls Lane and Chestnut Street in Frostburg, Allegany County, Maryland.</p> <p>The house is a two and a half story, brick structure erected in the mid-nineteenth century with a two and a half story, frame wing erected in the late nineteenth or early twentieth century attached to the back. The brick structure has three bays with an end door across the facade (southerly side) an internal chimney on the west gable end, returns on the gable ends, and a low pitch roof covered with asbestos shingles. The bond of the brick on the facade and the sides is American Common (5-stretchers and 1-header). The bricks around the two first floor front windows appear to have been altered at one time. The two small windows on the first floor of the west side and the one on the second floor of the east side do not look original to the house. The main windows of this portion are double-hung wooden sashes with two-over-two lights. The entranceway, on the easterly end of the facade, has side lights and a transom.</p> <p>The frame wing attached to the back has a low pitch roof, clapboard siding, and a porch and balcony along the easterly side. The exterior trim on this section is similar in style to a type popular at the end of the nineteenth century.</p> <p>The interior of the brick section has a hall with staircase on the easterly end and one large room on the west. The interior trim around the doorways and the mantelpiece consists of a plain flat pilaster on each side of the opening with a plain, heavy entablature as the lintel. The balustrade is plain. The doors of this section, including the front door, have two full length panels in each.</p> <p>Now apartments, the basic structure remains intact.</p>

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The house that stands at 69 West Main Street in Frostburg is significant as being representative of an architectural style and a way of life once found in Allegany County. Little is known about the history of the structure although the stylistic features of the earliest portion, the brick section along the street, are "country Greek Revival," a mode built in the area in the mid-nineteenth century.

It appears that the building was erected as a residence. The brick portion consists only of a stair and entrance hall and one room up and one down. Nothing is known about auxiliary wings or buildings of this original structure. About the turn of the twentieth century, a sizable addition was attached to the back. Today, the house contains two apartments.


