The Old Evans House is situated on Bowery Street in Frostburg. The original owner, Mr. Evans, was foreman of the local brick yard which was also located on Bowery Street. It is a large, practical building whose only condescension to elegance is the houndstooth frieze which runs just below the roof line on the original structure. Unfortunately, sight lines of the original structure have been marred by 20th century additions.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old Evans House is located at 65 Bowery Street in Frostburg, Allegany County on the northwest side of the street at the intersection of Stoyer Street.

The structure basically consists of a two story, three bays wide "L" shaped block. Additions for the purpose of a dining room, bar, and kitchen have been made on the front and northeastern side of the house. The additions are one story with a hip roof on the front addition and a simple shed roof on the side. The wall construction of the house features a wooden frame covered with weatherboard supported by a low roughly cut stone foundation with plain water table. The construction of the additions for the restaurant include a frame, covered by asbestos and vinyl siding on the front southeast side of the structure and cement block walls on the rear northern section. The gable roof of the main block which features a soffit, and frieze with houndstooth trim, is covered by replaced asphalt shingles as well as the shed roof of the addition. Windows in the house are double hung wooden sashes with plain trim and two-over-two lights. Windows in the commercial addition are double hung, one-over-one lights in the dining room and large sliding windows in the kitchen. The main entrance of the structure was originally on the front southeast side and was covered by an end porch which has now been replaced by the dining room. Entrances used presently are for both the restaurant and residence and are located on the rear, northwest, face of the addition and north east side, and are plain. One original brick chimney is located in the interior of the structure and several vents are presently jutting from the kitchen of the addition.

The building is structurally sound and has been somewhat altered, but restoration is certainly possible.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Old Evans House was erected between the mid to late nineteenth century for the original owner Mr. Evans. Mr. Evans was a foreman of a brick yard that formerly was located along Bowery Street, and the house was one of the first to be built on the street. Although the date of construction is unknown, the estimated time period in which it was built is based upon the years in operation of the Brick yard. The house is one of several located in Frostburg with the same style architecture and it retains much of its original external appearance other than that of the additions. The house is in need of repair and the opportunity for restoration is excellent in that the main block has the original features. The house is a good example of the large and practical style of architecture once commonly found in Allegany County among the upper middle class.

How many? Curved.

If not in hall, where is stair?

2. Wall finish: plaster, paneled, board partition

Note presence of chair rail, cornice, etc.

3. Fireplaces: How many? | Parallel to walls or diagonal in corner?


Mantels: wood--mouldings, pilasters, columns

3. Doors: on the inside of exterior doors, note the presence of applied flush boards and their direction (diagonal, vertical, horizontal). In general are doors paneled or ledge or other?

4. Door and window trim: plain, architrave; fluted, reeded; pilasters

5. Kitchen: Where is original if extant or known (marked by very large fireplace)? Separate building; wing to principal dwelling; within principal dwelling? On which floor of any of the above?
