The Percy Cemetery is located in a district known as Mt. Pleasant, originally considered to be on the outskirts of the town of Frostburg. The gravestones in the cemetery date back to the early 1800's and the variety of names found on the stones gives evidence to the fact that the cemetery was undoubtedly a communal burial ground for the town.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Percy Cemetery is located at the Northeast corner of the intersection of First Street and Lemmert's Alley in Frostburg, Allegany County, and encompasses about two acres of that corner property.

The cemetery consists of graves of persons dating back to the early 1800's. The cemetery lots are presently uncared for, and tall weeds, grass and brush cover the property. On some occasions volunteer groups lend their help to cut and clear the weeds and brush from the graves, but further action is needed to care for the cemetery's appearance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Percy Cemetery evolved in the early nineteenth century along with the founding of Frostburg. The proposed property originally was on the outskirts of the town, formerly known as Mt. Pleasant, and was situated on high ground with adequate drainage. The cemetery includes graves of young and old, rich and poor, prominent and improminent members of families of Frostburg which proves that the property was the communal burial ground for the town. Dates on some grave markers date back as far as the 1840's, and on still other markers, due to different types of erosion, the print cannot be read. The presence of such an old cemetery certainly enhances the cultural heritage of Frostburg, and the opportunity to clean up and instill a perpetual care program for the property is apparent.


