DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>This small 2 story frame house dates from the first half of the 19th century. It has been occupied by Pumphreys and Cromwells since it was built. The structure now faces Olen Drive on the east side but an earlier road on its west side was the original access, and the "front" facade is on the west. The house has two parts, placed end to end. The smaller south section, was a tenant house, brought from another location on the farm and joined to the main house. There is an interior brick chimney at the south end of the low A-roof. Two 4-pane "belly-flopper" windows on each side light the second floor. The first floor windows are small 6/6 pane openings. The doors, one in the center bay of each elevation, are board and batten. Another, smaller, door on the east side may have been enlarged from a window opening.</p> <p>The larger section of the house was built on this site. It has much higher ceilings and is a full 2 stories, with generous 6/6 pane windows on both floors. The front, west, elevation openings are evenly spaced. There are three bays with the main entrance in the center. The doorway is framed by transom and narrow side windows. There are no porches. The rear elevation has two separate entrances with a 1-pane transom light above each. An interior brick chimney is at each end of the A-roof. Both elevations have a simple box cornice with a shallow block dentil molding applied over it. The siding on the front is narrow and carefully placed; on the rear it is of graduated widths, narrower at the bottom than at the top. The south wing of the house, described above, is sheathed in rough sawn, wide boards.</p> <p>Though all but 36 acres of the original 600 granted to the Pumphrey family in 1754 have been sold, the present owner is still farming. Several early 20th century farm buildings, including a corn crib, stand in the rear yard. There are several branches of the Pumphrey family who arrived from England in the 18th century and settled in different parts of the county. The Pumphreys of Wellham's Crossroads intermarried with Cromwells from the same neighborhood. The name Charles Pumphrey appears from this location on the 1860 and 1878 maps.
