This one and one-half story gable roof cottage has an almost full width wall dormer across the front facade, with the plane of the roof continuing by to protect the full width porch. Windows in the dormer are paired, 1/1 sash, similar to two single windows at the first floor of the front elevation, to the right of a glass paneled door. Windows in the gable end walls are casements at the first floor, double hung at the second. The porch has a brick on cast block platform and heavy Tuscan columns. There is a chimney at the west end wall and a one story, full width partially enclosed rear porch. The simple molded rakes of the roof return. There is a one story concrete block garage, of no architectural significance at the rear of the property. The residence is rectangular in plan, 25' x 40', and is sheathed with asbestos shingles.





