A tri-gabled vernacular residence, 14 Murray Avenue has a standing seam metal roof, molded rakes and cornice and a full width one story front porch with shingles posts and elliptical panels between the bays. The front porch returns at the right side. All sash is 2/2, with the windows and transom lit entrance cased with flat trim and molded lintel caps. The frame structure retains its wood shingles, and is rectangular in plan, 15' x 45', two and one-half stories with a two story semi-octagonal bay centered in the right side elevation. There is a full width rear porch.


