An interesting example of the Dutch inspired colonial revival, 36 Murray Avenue has an asbestos shingled gambrel roof with large two bay wall dormers at either end of the front facade, each with paired 6/1 sash. The entrance is inset one bay at the left, the inset running the width of the front facade, with a glass paneled door to the left of a paired 6/1 window combination. The lower plane of the gambrel roof is bell-cast at the front edge and is supported in porch like fashion by square posts, stuccoed. Stucco is also the wall material, except for the gambrel ends which are asbestos shingles of good quality. Basically square in plan, 30' x 30', the lower part of the structure is tile, the upper frame.





