A two and one-half story, two by three bay shingle on frame Colonial Revival residence with a gable roof and pedimented dormers, 34 Southgate has a full width front porch on heavy turned columns, paired at the center bay with a full entablature. The molded cornice returns at the gable ends and is repeated in part as the rakes, with a horizontal flat fascia creating a stylized pediment facade at both end walls. Windows throughout are 6/1 with molded casings, butting at the second floor front to the deep fascia. The entrance has a pair of glass paneled doors with a molded lintel cap. There is a side entrance at the rear bay of the right elevation, with a shed roof porch on turned columns, and a rear porch in the extreme left bay. This porch has been infilled and is now shingled. Rectangular in plan, 25' x 40', two by three bays.





