A simple two story gable roof vernacular residence, 54 Southgate has a pedimented entrance porch on round untapered shafts and a one story screen porch at the right end wall, with turned Tuscan columns. The windows are paired at the second floor, triple at the first to the right of the entrance, all with 6/1 sash and louvered shutters. Side elevation windows are also 6/1, but placed as single units. Stucco on frame, rectangular in plan, 35' x 25', two by two bays, there is a one story porch running two thirds of the width of the rear elevation. A one story garage, of no significance, is located at the right property line, slightly behind the residence.


