52 Madison Place is a two story, three by three bay gable roofed vernacular structure with an excellent bracketed cornice and full width hipped roof porch. Rectangular in plan, 20' x 50' including a two bay rear ell, the frame structure is now sheathed in asbestos shingles. Windows are 2/2 with the second floor front windows framed into the deep frieze of the cornice. The remaining windows have molded lintels. The door has a flat transom. The porch is supported by heavy Doric columns without rail. There are four accessory structures to the rear of no significance.





