54 Madison Place is a simplified version of the Four Square style, rectangular in plan, 25' x 40', two and one-half stories, three by two bays with a hipped roof and hipped dormer at the front elevation. The roof has a flat frieze band, into which are framed the second floor windows. A full width hipped roof porch has been infilled with a sidelit door at the left bay and triple casements at the center and right bay. The porch door and windows have full bay width transoms, the bays defined by turned Tuscan columns and paneled aprons. The frame on brick structure retains its original slate roof and wood shingle wall treatment. There is a one story accessory structure at the rear, of no significance.
