56 Madison Place is a two story gable roof to the street vernacular structure of interest because of its Bungalow style full width one story front porch and deep consoles at the main roof. Two by four bays, rectangular in plan, 20' x 40', the house is stucco on frame, with a paired casement in the attic of the gable and 1/1 windows elsewhere. The gabled roof porch has tapered posts to the hand rail height where they rest on concrete block piers creating two equal bays, the left infilled with three windows, the right with a central door and flanking windows. Shed roof dormers light the attic at both side elevations, and there is a modern garage at the rear of the lot, of no significance.
