DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE	
<p>"Etowah" is a 2 1/2 story brick house surrounded by large trees. It was built "about 1824 by John G. Stockett on land patented in 1666". "Etowah stands on a part of Taylor's Choice, an early grant to Col. Thomas Taylor (Taillor). It was at Col. Thomas Taylor's house that Lord Baltimore and William Penn met in 1682 to discuss the boundaries of Maryland and Pennsylvania". (Source: J. Reany Kelly, December 1968.)</p> <p>The present property was one of the three dower farms given by George Stewart of "Doden" to his daughter in 1811.</p> <p>The house is a "Federal" style townhouse on a side-hall, double-parlor plan. The 2 story frame kitchen wing attached to the west side was built in the 1950's.</p> <p>The exterior brick-work is commonbond on the east, south, and west walls. The front wall is laid in Flemish bond. The front windows have stone sills and straight stone lintels with a square and medallion at each end. The doorway is inset in a segmental arch which is framed in panelling. The door, with a fanlight above and three lights on a side, is framed with Doric columns.</p> <p>The center windows on the east wall have been filled in because closets were made between the chimneys.</p> <p>The interior is elaborately detailed. The thick walls have reeded door frames and eight panel doors. The moldings bear the same motif as the front window lintels. A graceful segmental arch divides the hall at the base of the stair. A pair of painted "marble" columns are a later addition.</p> <p>The house is in excellent condition, furnished with family antiques. It appears on the 1860 map of the county as owned by a Mitchell. In 1878, it was owned by Julius Jordan. Reverend Louis Marshall, rector of St. James Church also lived there. His wife was a sister of Robert E. Lee, who often came to visit. (Source: J. Reany Kelly, December 1968.)</p>


