

2. Description of physical appearance:


The house is a typical one family residence of the 1920's of masonry foundation and wood frame with wood shingles and siding two stories high with basement underneath and a storage attic with dormers under a slate roof. There is an original porch with wood columns and a small original one story area off the kitchen. There are no existing outbuildings. The interior is typical of the 1920's with simple but attractive stairway, fireplace, wood trim and doors and hardware. Maintenance for some years has been minimal, resulting in many leaks, rotten exterior wood in some places, deterioration of gutters and downspouts, and general paint failure. The yard is badly overgrown with walks and fences failed. There is some water and termite damage on the inside. Interior plaster, finishes, kitchen fixtures and bathroom fixtures need complete rehabilitation and updating to make the house commercially viable. The electric, plumbing and heating systems need complete replacement. It is proposed to make the house very energy-efficient with a complete insulation job and by installing a new heating and air conditioning system by means of a two-speed heat pump system having also a hot water heating capacity. A new garage (separate from the house) is proposed and will be attractive for lease or rental.

3. Statement of significance:

The house and property at # 2 North Acton Place, which is currently badly in need of complete rehabilitation, is an imminent part of the compact site and setting surrounding Acton Hall. Major rehabilitation of Acton Hall itself is now almost complete and it will soon be proposed for the National Register. The rehabilitation of # 2 North Acton Place will not only enhance the setting of Acton Hall but will provide as well a properly restored house typical of the early 1920's in Annapolis. The restored house will then be a livable residence with updated conveniences and essential energy efficiency features.




Sketch Map of National Historic Landmark Boundary for the Colonial Historic District of Annapolis. unsealed





