

**Capsule Summary for 78 Maryland Avenue
AA-1844**

Built in the period between 1877-1883, the building at 78 Maryland Avenue is located on property that was originally part of the large tract of land associated with the Bordley-Randall house. In the mid-to late 19th century, this large tract of land was subdivided and built upon with both residential and commercial structures. The building at 78 Maryland Avenue was constructed in the same period as most of the buildings found on the northern side of Maryland Avenue and provides a good illustration of the subdivision and growth of the city from its 18th century origins of large and prominent estates to the more densely built 19th century Annapolis.

Originally constructed in the Italianate style, the building at 78 Maryland Avenue, a modest, two-story wood frame structure, that underwent a major alteration in the 1940s and now appears in a commercial pop-style building. The facade was covered in glazed tiles and asbestos shingles were put on the southwest and rear elevations. The front elevation, measuring 18 feet in width, is two bays wide and features the addition of a marquee with projecting central signage. The marquee was constructed between 1945 and 1953.¹ The flat roof slopes to the rear of the building and is not visible from Maryland Avenue.

Located on the north side of Maryland Avenue, the building at 76-78 Maryland Avenue was constructed in 1877-1883 as a duplex structure, providing commercial storefronts on the first floor and rental apartments on the second floor. The two-story commercial building is similar in size and scale to the other commercial/residential buildings on the block and was constructed in the same time period. The front elevation faces Maryland Avenue, while the rear elevation extends along Randall Court. According to historic maps, deed research, and physical evidence the building located at 76-78 Maryland Avenue was constructed as a detached structure and sold by Adeline Randall in 1917. The east elevation is separated from its neighbor at 80-82 Maryland Avenue by a three-foot passageway leading to the second story fire exit.

Originally constructed in the Italianate style, the building at 78 Maryland Avenue, a modest, two-story wood frame structure, that underwent a major alteration in the 1940s and now appears in a commercial pop-style building. The facade was covered in glazed tiles and asbestos shingles were put on the southwest and rear elevations. The front elevation, measuring 18 feet in width, is two bays wide and features the addition of a marquee with projecting central signage. The marquee was constructed between 1945 and 1953.¹ The flat roof slopes to the rear of the building and is not visible from Maryland Avenue.

The 1885 Sanborn Maps indicate the existence of two one-story rear ells, common space between the separate shops of 76-78 Maryland Avenue. Between 1897 and 1903, the one rear ell was removed and a dividing wall was inserted in the common space. The 1921 Sanborn Map documents that a second story was added to the rear ell. By 1930, another two-story rear ell was applied to the building.

The facade features a recessed store entry located underneath a segmental arch that has been cut into the original exterior wall of the building. The recessed opening is flanked by plate glass display windows with a projecting beaded cornice. The display windows are set upon a vertical wood foundation.

Located above the storefront is a rounded-edge marquee with recessed

lighting on the soffit. A vertical neon sign projects from under the marquee and extends to the roofline. The second story of the facade has been covered by glazed tiles with a sunburst design at the corners. Metal flashing appears at the roofline.

The rear elevation, facing Randall Court, is covered with asbestos shingles and is pierced at the northwest corner on the first floor by a 6 panelled entry door. The west elevation, also covered with asbestos shingles, contains a single window opening that has been enclosed.

The interior of 78 Maryland Avenue, now a sandwich shop, consists of a large front room and three smaller rooms at the rear of the first floor. A hallway, beginning at the western corner of the large front room, extends to the exit rear of the building. The three smaller room, accessed from the hallway, provide space for storage and two restrooms. The historic interior was removed at an earlier period. Presently, the molding and surrounds are contemporary round edged wood, the ceiling is acoustical tile, and the floor is linoleum. Access to the second floor has been removed and it is currently vacant.

Designated as Lots 76, 77, 78, 79 and 80 on the Stoddert Map of 1718, the Bordley-Randall house property was originally bounded by College Avenue (originally called Tabernacle Avenue), Prince George Street, Maryland Avenue, State Circle and North Street. The Thomas Bordley family, who owned the property from 1726 to 1810, built the large Bordley-Randall house. In 1811, following John Beale Bordley's death, John Johnson, Chancellor of Maryland, bought the property and sold it that same year to William S. Green. In 1847, Alexander Randall purchased the property and, during the latter half of the 19th century, began to subdivide and improve the large tract of land with commercial and residential buildings along Maryland Avenue.

Based upon historic maps, 1883 tax assessments and historic photographs, the store/dwelling on the site was erected in the period between 1877 and 1883 by either Alexander Randall or his Estate.² When Alexander Randall died in November of 1881, all rental leases for Maryland Avenue property were deeded to his second wife, Elizabeth B. Randall.³ Upon the death of Elizabeth Randall in July 1895, the property was conveyed to the Randall Trustees for distribution. Alexander Randall Trustees leased the building in 1880 to Girhard Marischen for a term of 99 years.⁴ Marischen assigned the lease to Edwin S. Tunis, who in turn

assigned the lease to J. Gatten Hagner.⁵ Hagner, the son of Thomas and Catherine Jane Gamble Hagner, was born in 1847. He worked as a professor at St. John's College.⁶ During this time the store was used as a music shop and later a barber shop.

In 1895, Alexander Randall trustees conveyed the property known as 78 Maryland Avenue to Adeline Randall, the youngest daughter of Alexander Randall.⁷ The 1900 Census Records indicate that Frank Fink and his family resided in the second floor apartment at 78 Maryland Avenue, while operating a grocery mart on the first floor. Fink, born in 1855, was originally from Germany and had come to the United States in 1886. The 1910 Census Records indicated Phil Miller, a blacksmith for the United States Navy, lived in the apartment with his family. The 1908 Sanborn Maps document the first floor store operated as a tailor's shop until 1913 when it was again used as a barber shop.

In 1917, Abraham Snyder purchased the property from Adeline Randall and the leases from Fanny Hagner.⁸ Abraham Snyder conveyed the property to Isaac and Minnie Snyder in 1919.⁹ Isaac Snyder, born in Russia in 1877, lived with his family in the apartment while operating a tailor shop on the first floor. The City Directories for 1928-1929 list the occupant as Isaac Snyder, tailor. After the death of Isaac, his wife Minnie conveyed the property to George and

Elizabeth Davis.¹⁰ The Davis' owned and operated stationary store at 76 Maryland Avenue. In 1945, the building was sold to Eugene L. and Jarma May Albright.¹¹ According to the City Directories of 1949 and 1954, Eugene Albright, a radio sales representative, maintained the building as a radio, television, records, and appliance shop.

The property was conveyed several times over the next thirty years, until it was purchased by Spearhead Incorporated from James Stegman.¹² Currently the first floor of the building is occupied by Subway, a sandwich shop, while the second floor remains vacant.










