This post 1930 English Cottage has a steeply pitched pointed gable entrance pavillion centered in the gambrel main roof, with a round arched with Gothic tracery window at the second floor and a round arched fan over the entrance. The fan light has a heavily molded round arched frame on sawn consoles and flat pilasters. The main gambrel roof has shed dormers flanking the entrance pavillion, with a single 6/1 window in the right, paired 6/1 in the left. The left third of the residence is inset at the first floor to accomodate a side porch, with turned Tuscan columns supporting a full frieze. The columns are paired at the left bay and there is a molded hand rail with square balusters along that end of the porch. All other windows are also 6/1, with unenriched casings, and rake boards are flat with returns at the leading edge of the lower gambrel to start a deep eaves. The house is rectangular in plan, 40' x 35', 3 by 2 bays, and there is a one story garage at the rear lot line.


