A two story, rectangular plan 20' x 35', common bond brick structure, 43 Lafayette has a gable roof with corbeled brick cornice and full return at the gable end to create a pediment. Originally two by six bays, the side elevations and the first floor of the front have been altered by infilling windows and replacing the entrance. The side wall is now five bays at the second floor, three at the first, while the front is two bays at the second and three at the first. All windows in the side and rear elevations and the second floor of the front are 1/1, rectangular sash set in segmental brick openings, the entrance now a pair of glass over raised panel doors, all c.1970s. The half round window in the gable is original, but the tall brick chimney at the ridge line is c.1930.
