Originally a two story vernacular structure, 38 Lafayette has had a false Mansard roof and third floor added at the turn of the century. Rectangular in plan, 16' x 50', three by four bays, the Mansard has two gabled wall dormers with 2/2 sash. All other windows are also 2/2, with flat casings and molded lintels. The door, in the left bay of the three bay front facade, has a flat, full width transom and sidelights, with a modern six panel door and later brick stoop. The cornice has four sawn brackets and returns slightly at the side elevations. The rear one bay deep section remains two stories and has a shed roof. The frame structure retains its original wood shingles.






