The walls are now asbestos shingle, hiding the original fabric. Paired 6/1 sash create two bays at the second floor of the front facade, with a triple 6/1 window and entrance door at the first floor protected by a full width hipped roof porch on later wrought iron pilasters with later wrought iron rails. Windows in the east and west end elevations are 6/1. A one bay wide rear porch with hipped roof is attached to the southwest corner.
