A brick Four Square plan with hipped roof and hipped two bay dormers at the front and sides, 172 West has 1/1 sash set into rectangular openings with granite sills and lintels. A full width one story front porch has a low hipped roof and square brick posts with cast concrete balusters in an urn shape. The deeply overhanging eaves break around a two story three part bay unit at the rear of the right side wall. The urn-like balustrade used in the porch is repeated as a wall at the sidewalk line, with granite posts. Rectangular in plan, 25' x 40', with a one story modern rear addition of 35' x 65' size, of no significance but hidden from view from West Street.






