

CAPSULE SUMMARY
196 West Street, Annapolis (AA-2006)

The building at 196 West Street was constructed for speculative developer John H. White as rental housing in 1899. The wood frame structure, clad in brick, consisted of a row of five dwellings anchored by a grocery at the corner West Street and Madison Place. Sold by White's heirs in 1920, the building was owner occupied for the first time in 1920, when the occupying tenant purchased the building. While residing in the building, owner Ettore Pantaleo operated a shoe repair shop. The commercial use of the building prevailed by the latter part of the 20th century, when the former dwelling was dressed with a canted storefront.

The building is one of a row of six modest-sized two-story buildings typical of late 19th and early 20th century speculative building forms. The row is set upon a low brick foundation, and is covered with a continuous gable roof, clad with standing seam metal. The two bay-wide buildings are constructed of wood frame with pressed brick facades laid in stretcher bond with random rows of headers. The facades are characterized by segmental arched window openings with 2/2 windows. Several of the individual buildings have projecting storefront additions, while others retain their original flat-fronted facades with side entry doors. Some of the buildings retain their brick chimney. A continuous wood, box cornice extends across the row of six buildings. A two-story wood frame ell, spanning two-thirds of the rear elevation, is covered with a sloped roof, extends off the rear of the building.

The building at 196 West Street is one of a row of six modest-sized two-story buildings typical of late 19th and early 20th century speculative building forms. Built in 1899, the row is located on the north side of West Street and faces south. The row is set upon a low brick foundation, and is covered with a continuous gable roof, clad with standing seam metal. The two bay-wide buildings are constructed of wood frame with pressed brick facades laid in stretcher bond with random rows of headers. The facades are characterized by segmental arched window openings with 2/2 windows. Several of the individual buildings have projecting storefront additions, while others retain their original flat-fronted facades with side entry doors. Some of the buildings retain their brick chimney. A continuous wood, box cornice extends across the row of six buildings. A two-story wood frame ell, spanning two-thirds of the rear elevation, is covered with a sloped roof, extends off the rear of the building.

Exterior Description:

The former dwelling at 196 West Street is the easternmost building of the group. The building was constructed abutting the existing late 19th century building at 194 West Street. The building, altered in the latter part of the 20th century, presently features a projecting canted storefront with a central, recessed wood and glass entry door. The flanking show windows have plate glass glazing with transoms above. The storefront is set upon a brick foundation and is covered with a half-hipped roof, clad with standing seam metal. The second story of the facade is divided into three bays, defined by three segmentally arched window openings. The openings, defined by double rows of soldier course bricks and wood sills, have 2/2 rectangular wood sash.

The north (rear) elevation of 196 West Street faces a rear alley and parking lot. The building has a two-story rear ell that extends across two of the three bays of the main block. The exposed bay of the main block features a single 6/6 window on the second story. The ell has a flat, standing seam metal roof and a one-story shed roof wing. It has 6/6 windows and a plywood door on the second story and a replacement door on the first story, under a set of makeshift, straight-flight wooden steps. The side wall of the ell has a single 6/6 window on the second story, and a pair of windows on the first story.

The building at 196 West Street was constructed for speculative developer John H. White as rental housing in 1899. The wood frame structure, clad in brick, consisted of a row of five dwellings anchored by a grocery at the corner West Street and Madison Place. Sold by White's heirs in 1920, the building was owner occupied for the first time in 1920, when the occupying tenant purchased the building. While residing in the building, owner Ettore Pantaleo operated a shoe repair shop. The commercial use of the building prevailed by the latter part of the 20th century, when the former dwelling was dressed with a canted storefront.

Site History

In the middle part of the 19th century, Nicholas Brewer, Jr. owned the property where the row of six attached buildings denoted as 196 through 206 West Street now stand. Born in 1795, Brewer was a graduate of St. John's College (class of 1811). During his career as an attorney, Brewer served as Judge of the Second Judicial Circuit from 1851 to 1864. Upon his death in 1864, Brewer devised his holdings amongst his eight surviving children. The property along West Street remained largely unimproved during the Brewer heirs' ownership.

West Street, a primary transportation corridor into the state capital since the 18th century, had developed as a mixed residential and commercial route. As development moved west to the outskirts of the colonial city by the latter part of the 19th century, the residential nature of the street was dominant with an abundance of freestanding and attached single-family dwellings typically occupied by European immigrants and African Americans. The dwellings on the south side of West Street obscured the commercial enterprises located on the rear of the lots. This included a significant number of livery stables and wagon sheds, particularly between Lafayette Avenue and Southgate Avenue. On the north side of the street, the dwellings fronted unimproved land, as improvements on this portion of West Street west of Lafayette Street were generally sited along the road. During this period, new neighborhoods were beginning to develop around this part of West Street – Murray Hill was located to the south of West Street, to the west of Southgate Avenue, and President's Hill was established to the northwest of West Street, between Madison Place and Jefferson Place. By 1930, the area directly north of the buildings at 196-206 West Street was improved by the construction of freestanding single-family dwellings when Munroe Court was created.

Building History

In June 1891, the Brewer family sold the single unimproved lot on West Street, east of Madison Place, to John H. White for \$800. The sale also included property to the east, which was already improved by the construction of two attached single-family dwellings and a corner grocery with housing above. White, born in August 1838, was a bricklayer and speculative developer. The purchase of the unimproved property along one of Annapolis' primary transportation routes on the outskirts of the growing capital was clearly intentional on the part of White in 1891. He proceeded to subdivide the corner site into six deep rectangular lots. As indicated by the census records and *Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps*, the lots were improved in 1899 with the construction of row of attached dwellings. These dwellings were integrated into the three existing buildings erected during the ownership of the Brewer family, creating a row of nine attached dwellings. Like the anchoring building on the east side of the now enlarged structure, the corner building at 206 West Street included a grocery on the first story and a dwelling on the second story. The two-story buildings were constructed of wood frame with a two-story rear ell. The facades were clad with a brick facing that wrapped around the side elevation of the corner building at 206 West Street. The rear of each property had one story wood frame garages, all attached in the row. The entire row of garages was razed by 1954.

White used the new buildings as rental property, leasing them initially to European immigrants and African Americans. The tax assessments show that White, who was charged \$3,600 in 1899 for the six new buildings at 196-206 West Street, was responsible for building a number of frame and brick single-family dwellings along West Street and Madison Place in the 1890s. Upon his death in June 1912, the property was devised among his children. During the year, the heirs divided and subdivided the holdings until daughter Mary Ellen White had gained title to the buildings. A teacher, Mary Ellen White had married printer Lemuel C. Baldwin in 1888. The first of the dwellings sold independently was 196 West Street, which was purchased by Ettore and Concetta Pantaleo for \$2,100 in October 1920. The census records, taken June 1920, indicate Pantaleo and his family had leased the dwelling prior to buying it. Born in 1881 in Italy, Pantaleo had immigrated to the United States in 1900, becoming a citizen in 1917. He maintained his own shoe repair shop, which according to the city directory and the *Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps* was operated from his West Street house as early as 1913.

By 1921, as noted on the *Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps*, the wood frame of the buildings was gradually reclad with brick facing. This refacing began at 206 West Street, and moved eastward to 196 West Street by 1930.

In July 1973, the ninety-two year old Pantaleo sold the building at 196 West Street and moved to Baltimore City, where he died two years later. He had sold the building to Robert Carl Meck, who owned the former storage warehouse at 209 West Street. Meck converted the entire building for commercial use. In the early 1970s through the 1980s, Bob's Coin and Gun Shop occupied the former dwelling. It was sold in 1983 to Joan Olive King, who sold it three years later to White's Row Partnership. The partnership also owned the former

dwelling at 198 West Street. In 1991, the building was sold to J. Donald Ridenbaugh, who conveyed it in 1999 to the present owners, Steven R. Ames and Robert E. Maloney. It is currently used as a store.
