One of a pair of Annapolis Federal Vernacular townhouses, 8 Hill Street is two stories, two by three bays, rectangular in plan 13'x30' including a two story shed rear ell that is part of the original construction. The gable roof has a simple, continuous boxed cornice without returns, and the rakes at the gable end are flat. A one story continuous front porch has a low hipped roof and is supported on turned and square posts, with a molded hand rail and square balusters. The frame structure is clapboard, probably the original finish. All windows are 2/2 with flat casings and molded lintel caps, and the entrance in the end bay has a flat transom. There are no out-buildings.

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


