A minor variety of the Four-Square residence, 19 Jefferson Place is two and one-half stories with a hipped roof with centered cross gable at the side elevations. Frame with aluminum siding, rectangular in plan 24'x40' with a full width hipped roof front porch on square posts without rails at the front but with square balusters at the end sections. All windows are 1/1 in the 3 by 4 bay composition, the entrance in the right bay with a flat transom. Windows at the first floor front are set in a projecting three part bay unit. The asphalt shingled roof has a hipped dormer with hinged casements at the front and a molded cornice. The front porch returns at the left elevation to a two story ell of original construction, and there is a full width one story entrance porch at the rear.

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
