DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

"Willow Lake Farm" is a large tract of land with several houses on it. This house is the oldest and stands on the most prominent site at the top of a hill overlooking Hundley Pond. The 2 1/2 story brick house was built about 1870. It has a center hall plan, one room deep. The facade has three bays. A gable containing a small, circular attic window covers the center bay. The interior has been modernized; the chimneys closed and the floors covered with linoleum. The moldings and stair are original. The name J. Henry Sellman appears with this house on the 1878 map of the County. The house is now occupied by the farm manager.



The house on the photos was built in 1906 according to the landowners. It is currently being restored. It is a ballon frame house, pegged and corner supports with a brick covering.

The 1870 house is located west of the house on the map. It was dismantled in the 1940's. The staircase, shutters, and windows are stored in a barn on the land. The current owners have bought additional acreage, and now own 550 acres of land.

Hundley Pond is now Willow Lake Pond officially as of 1974.

Sellman lived in the early house, but not in the house in the photos. It is the oldest house on the farm. There is another house built around 1906-1912 on the farm also.

The 1906 house burned a few years ago. The central double fireplaces are gone, a new fireplace has been put in. Parts of the ballon framing are incorporated into the restoration by the landowners.

^{originally} extended to both sides of Birdsville Rd. (see 1860 and 1875 maps) -

- known as "Clifton" while the Sellmans owned it.

Now called "Willow Lake Farm"

Ethel's gr. father Na Daniel Davis, plus his two brothers Joe and Dave, and sisters all worked and lived at Clifton, as farm hands and Chambermaids. Her gr father and grandmother, Sarah, lived in the Summer Kitchen Bldg where Sarah worked. Her father Emory was born there, then he tenant-farmed on Nathan Child's land opposite Birdsville store and on site of Homestead Nurseries.

Miss Lucy Sellman sold "Clifton" to Mr. Simmons, he to Ben Hundley and Ben to present owner Dr. Suraci from College Park (?) who spends weekends etc. there, living in the brick house close to road. His caretaker and farmer is Arthur Dove.

Ethel's property is called "Little Clifton"

She has an old photo of her gr father and Mr. Simmons standing behind the orig. Sellman main house (which is gone now): it was white clapboard with porch galleries across first and 2nd floors at rear brick foundation.

obtained by interviews with ^① Ethel Davis Sharps (b. 1907) (occupant of "Little Clifton"; across Birdsville Rd.) and ^② Arthur Dove, farm mgr. for Dr. Suraci, current owner of "Clifton" (now known as "Willow Lake Farm").

1860 Martenet map - "Mrs. Sellman", owner.

1878 Hopkins map - "Res. - J. Henry Sellman, 232a."

c. 1900 - occupied by sisters Miss Lucy Sellman, Miss Sophie Sellman (who died in a horse accident), and their brother Stockett Sellman. The main house at the Sellman farm was 2-story frame, side-hall Federal-style, 3-bay with door in left bay. 2-story wing/left side. Classical-columned entry-porch. Double-gallery full-width screened porches on rear elevation/main block. 1-story kitchen wing left end of 2-story wing. (See accompanying Copies of 1934 photos of the house; originals in possession of Ethel Sharps.)

1906 - ~~Sellman~~ ^{Sellman} Stockett built a house east of the above-described main house. Today it is a 5-bay brick I-house, but Mrs. Sharps thinks it was frame with weatherboard siding when first built. It has apparently been veneered with brick. Shallow roof pitch. 6/9 windows. Cross-gable at attic level with circular window.

1934 - Mr. Oliver Simmons from Cleveland, Ohio, came as a prospective buyer to see the farm. He took pictures and sent copies to Emory Davis, Ethel Sharps' father.

1935 - Mr. Simmons bought the farm from Miss Lucy who was at least 60 yrs. old by then.

Under Mr. Simmons' ownership the farm fields were left untended and allowed to grow up.

c. 1940 - The farm was sold to Ben Hundley who enlisted the help of

The Soil Conservation Office to put the fields back into production: corn, hay, and oat crops. He built a new brick barn c. 1942-4.

He built a neo-Georgian-style 2-story brick house-with wings for himself, close to Birdsville Rd., to the north of the farm entrance. He may have demolished the old main house about this time, because Mrs. Sharps believes he re-used the porch columns off the old house for the front portico on his new house (see accompanying of new house.)

There is also a rumor that the staircase from the old house is stored in one of the barns on the property.

Mr. Hundley built two small brick tenant houses (2-story 2-bay), one near the new brick barn, the other to the right of the entrance road opposite the lake.

Perhaps he's the one who veneered the Stockett Sellman House since he seemed to like brick quite well.

Mr. Hundley hired Arthur Dove to farm for him.

C. 1960's - Property sold to Dr. Suraci, current owner, a plastic Surgeon from Washington who uses the farm for weekend and summer retreats. He occupies the neo-Georgian house, his daughter the tenant hse near the lake, and Arthur Dove the tenant house near the brick barn. The Stockett Sellman Hse. is rented.

Dr. Suraci's name for the property is "Willow Lake Farm". He has acquired parts of two other farms which adjoin his land on the west side and extend to Wayson Rd. One of them is the Asher farm which contains an old pegged tobacco barn (abandoned) and a hip-roofed 2-bay tenant hse (rough shape) on Elmer Hagner Rd. which he rents. The main Asher hse he burned down 10 yrs ago.
