Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

This is a one and one-half story frame residence, located immediately adjacent to the ramp in the southwest quadrant of the MD 174 @I-97 interchange. Gaither Drive is a small side road that follows the curve of the interchange ramp. The house is situated on a knoll, and there are a variety of small and mature trees around the property. This is a gable-and-wing house, and it is clad with asbestos shingles. The house has a concrete foundation and a basement, and asphalt shingles cover the roof. There is a gabled dormer on the main façade, and two gabled dormers on the rear. A chimney rises from the center of the house as well as the exterior, south gable end. There are two entrances on the main façade of the building, each with single-leaf doors. Both have painted iron grilles. The door on the front gable wing also features a fluted wood surround capped with a broken and denticulated pediment, a low brick stairway. There is a small porch at the other front door, with a metal awning and an iron balustrade and support posts. A third door, also with an iron grille, is on the south gable end alongside the exterior chimney. The house has 1/1 and 6/6 double-hung sash-type windows, as well as two five-part picture windows.

There are two other buildings on the property. The first is a small, rectangular, concrete block structure, single-cell, with a gable roof, 3/1 window on each side, and a gable end chimney. The second is a one-story frame building with gable roof and concrete foundation. The building is sheathed with asphalt shingles, and an interior brick chimney is situated off-center. Most of the windows and other openings, including the door, are boarded up. This building appears to have served as a residence.

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According to the resident, Mrs. Gaither, her husband built this house around 1947. The U.S.G.S. 15' topographic quadrangle for 1947 shows the house, as does the U.S.G.S. 7.5' topographic quadrangle for 1949. The house and property are probably contained within lands that were subdivided in 1921 Burton A. Gaither in the Glenburnie area.

The Gaither house is typical of the functional, smaller houses of the post World War II period, and is characteristic of single family houses throughout the Mid-Atlantic region. The property lacks significant architectural distinction and therefore would not meet the National Register Criterion C. Furthermore, the Gaither House has no known significant association with important persons or events, nor would it likely have significance for the potential information contained in associated archaeological materials (see Gibb, March 2001). The Gaither House is unlikely to qualify for listing in the National Register of Historic Places under Criteria A, B, C, or D.
