Building No. 138 is located on the east side of Arundel Cove, opposite the main concentration of Yard buildings. This long, one-story, frame building is rectangular in plan and rests on a concrete block foundation. The walls are sheathed in aluminum siding and the gable roof is covered with asphalt shingles. Fenestration includes a centrally located pair of double pedestrian doors in the south gable end, a single, metal pedestrian door and wooden steps on the north side of the east facade, and a large wooden, track door and adjacent wooden platform, also on the south end of the east facade. Neither the pedestrian doors nor the aluminum siding is original to the building.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

This property is associated with the development of the Coast Guard Yard at Curtis Bay. The Yard was first established on this site in 1899 as a boat repair and construction facility for the Revenue Cutter Service, the forerunner of the present-day Coast Guard. At that time, the facility was known as the Revenue Cutter Service Depot, and generally served vessels stationed in the mid-Atlantic area.

The establishment of the Depot was related to the emphasis on Naval preparedness that took place following the Spanish American war. Prior to the establishment of the Depot, vessel repair and construction were handled by private concerns. Starting as a collection of a few frame buildings, the Depot, after 1940 known as the Yard, expanded as its mission and capabilities increased. The Yard was at its productive peak and greatest size during World War II, with most surviving historic structures dating to that time.

Building No. 138 is one of only three buildings that survive from a complex of about forty buildings that were erected in this area of the Yard during the early years of World War II as a Coast Guard anti-aircraft and night vision training facility. This building was designed as the training reception center and clothing distribution building, and is now used for storage purposes. The majority of the training center complex was built by Cummings Construction Company. The land where building No. 138 is located was acquired in the early 1940s, and is not part of the original Yard property.

This resource is not included in the proposed National Register Historic District.

Due to its isolation, loss of historic context and issues of physical integrity, this building is not included in the proposed historic district.

### Criterion A—Historical Associations

Building #138 was part of an approximately 40 building complex erected on this side of Arundel Cove as an anti-aircraft and night vision training facility.

### Criterion C—Design Significance

This building, like most of the other buildings that were part of the training facility were built by a local construction company and use designs and materials typical of the mid-20th century.


