Based on the available information, the building at 7351 Ritchie Highway does not appear to meet the National Register Criteria for individual listing. The one-and-one-half story commercial building was initially constructed as a residential building and is typical of many early 20th century gable front cottages. Probably constructed in the 1920s, prior to the construction of Governor Ritchie Highway in 1938, it is now isolated from its historic context and significantly altered to serve commercial purposes. The building at 7351 Ritchie Highway does not appear to possess any particular significance under any of the Criteria and, moreover, is lacking in integrity. It is located well outside the National Register eligible section of Glen Burnie.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

Contributing Resource Count: 2 buildings.

This one-and-one-half-story, front-gabled frame commercial building initially served as a dwelling. Typical of many early-twentieth-century rural dwellings, it originally had a hip-roofed front porch that spanned the gable front. This porch has been enclosed to form a vestibule. In the center of this elevation is a front door flanked on each side by two single-light, elongated windows and accessed by a wood ramp and staircase. The building has a central brick flue on the ridge of the roof. A shed dormer has been added on the roof's northeast slope. The windows on the side elevations are paired and single six-over-one sash and are possibly the original glazing. The building faces onto Ritchie Highway, and a driveway on its right side leads to a hip-roofed frame garage to its rear.




