Building NA15, located at the Naval Radio Transmitter Facility in the North Severn area of the US Naval Academy in Anne Arundel County, is not located within the boundaries of a National Register-eligible historic district and is not considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

Building NA15, known historically as Quarters B and built in 1918, is a one-story, single-family frame dwelling. The building is L-shaped in plan with a main block and wings. The main block is covered with a low gable roof with shed roof dormers; the side wings are covered with low hipped roofs. The walls are clad with vinyl siding and the windows feature 6/6 and 8/12 sash.

The Naval Radio Transmitter Facility was established in 1918 on land which was prior to that used by the Navy as the Naval Aviation Camp, Greenbury Point, and prior to that as the Naval Academy Dairy Farm. The Radio Transmitter Facility provides low-frequency communications support to the Navy's fleet, including strategic and tactical submarines patrolling the Atlantic Ocean and to NATO forces, and Defense Communications Agency.

Building NA15, built as a residence, is considered a support facility to the primary mission of the Radio Transmitter Facility. The building lacks the architectural distinctiveness to qualify for listing under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under Criteria A or B.

Building NA20, located at the Naval Radio Transmitter Facility in the North Severn area of the US Naval Academy in Anne Arundel County, is not located within the boundaries of a National Register-eligible historic district and is not considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

Building NA20 was originally built in 1922 as a garage to Quarter B. The building is a three-bay structure with three garage door openings. It is set upon a concrete foundation, is covered with a gable roof and has vinyl walls.

The Naval Radio Transmitter Facility was established in 1918 on land which was prior to that used by the Navy as the Naval Aviation Camp, Greenbury Point, and prior to that as the Naval Academy Dairy Farm. The Radio Transmitter Facility provides low-frequency communications support to the Navy's fleet, including strategic and tactical submarines patrolling the Atlantic Ocean and to NATO forces, and Defense Communications Agency.

Building NA20, was built as a garage for Building NA15 and lacks the architectural or historical significance necessary to be considered for listing on the Register.

DESCRIPTION

Contributing Resource Count: 2

Naval Academy North Severn records indicate construction of Quarters A (Building NA15) first occurred in 1918. An irregularly-shaped single family dwelling with an associated garage (Building NA20, OIC Garage) immediately to the north (Photo 41501-7), the dwelling stands on the east side of a macadam drive paralleling Hooper High Road near its intersection with Beach Circle Drive in Anne Arundel County, Maryland. Mature shrubs obscure the southern portion of the dwelling's main, western elevation (Photo 41501-6).

Quarters A has experienced a number of changes to its form since first erected. One story hipped-roof wings or bays have been appended to the east, south and west elevations of a central one-and-one-half story rectangular plan topped by a gable roof. A one story gable-roofed ell has also been attached to the central portion's north elevation. Brick foundations undergird the entire structure while vinyl siding covers the exterior wall surfaces. Pairs of small dormers on either side of the central gable ridge possess shed-roofs. Brick chimney piles penetrate both sides of the gable's ridge. Asphalt shingles cover all roof surfaces.

The main, western elevation facing the macadam drive displays a hipped-roof wing on its southwest corner. A shed-roofed porch occupies the northwest side of the elbow shielding a thin wooden door squeezed into the south corner of the west elevation. The gable-roofed portion of the elevation possesses five bays while another two bays occupy the southwest ell's west elevation. Most window openings contain modern wooden sash with plastic muntins dividing the windows into eight-over-12 lights. The northern gable-roofed wing displays two bays consisting of a single six-over-six wooden sash and a triple six-over-six.

Fenestration along the building's southern elevation totals five openings. Two windows penetrate the southwest wing's south elevation while the gable-roofed portion contains two additional openings. A hipped-roof bay window contains the south elevation's fifth opening (Photo 41501-4). Plastic muntins dividing lights into eight-over-eight sash forms the predominant type on the south elevation. Some windows are paired; the bay displays a pair of six-over-nine sash. Single six-over-nine windows light the side elevations of the bay.




Quarter A's eastern elevation features hipped-roof wings placed to either side of a central entrance vestibule (Photo 41501-5). The symmetrical spacing of the two wings communicates Georgian or Colonial Revival architectural tenets. The use of pilasters surrounding the wing's window openings and the central doorway reinforce the notion of Colonial Revival stylings. Sidelights flank the wing's triple six-over-six wooden sash windows although paint removal treatments underway during field review of the dwelling shrouded their finish. The brick foundations of the wings extend several centimeters (six inches) above the exterior cladding of the central gable-roofed portion of the structure.

The OIC Garage (Building NA20) stands one story tall atop a stone and poured concrete foundation (Photo 41501-8). Corrugated tin sheathes the garage's gable roof. Two bays consisting of a six-over-six wooden sash and a wood door penetrate the southern gable end (Photo 41501-9). Three garage doors composed of two vertically rolling doors and a pair of x-board-and-batten double leaf doors occupy the western elevation. The garage possesses vinyl siding.
