Building 2272 was a wood frame warehouse located at Fort Meade. The storehouse was one of several warehouses situated north of Rock Avenue. The Army believes the building dates to the World War I period. However, the submitted drawings indicate that the storehouse reflects the Army's standardized construction plan 700 series from World War II, the first wave of mobilization construction. The building is a one story rectangular, gabled roof structure with an open space interior plan. It rests on concrete piers. The warehouse has undergone several significant changes including the application of T-111 siding over the original board and batten, alteration of the original openings, and the removal of the metal ventilator. The wood framing reveals widespread deterioration. I believe that these alterations have compromised the integrity of this simple, utilitarian building.


