Located on the west side of Solley Road south of Fort Smallwood Road, Solley elementary school is a one story brick building constructed in 1937. The County built a large addition onto the school in 1954. The building is capped by a flat roof and is characterized by repetitious window pattern of 9/9 sashes. The addition doubled the size and configuration of building, altering its appearance. Both sections of the school are void of distinctive design features and they appear as a plain, utilitarian institutional facility. The building does not embody distinctive characteristics of type, period, or method of construction. In addition, there is no evidence which supports the buildings historic significance. The building does not represent a consolidation school of the 1920s, according to Ms. Donna Ware. OPS concurred with AA County that the building did not possess significant characteristics to be eligible for the Maryland Register.




