DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

"Tudor" is a large frame house that rambles in a complex series of additions of various sizes and styles. The central section has 2 1/2 stories and a two story portico across the front. The portico has a brick floor. The front wall of this section has horizontal siding with flat beaded joints. The portico at one time contained an enclosed sleeping porch on the second level. A door now opens into space. This section of the house has rather low ceilings. It contains the main stairway and one room on each floor. Two dormers on each side of the roof light the third floor chamber. There is one large end chimney and a full brick basement.

To the South is an addition, with 2 stories and much higher ceilings. The windows on the second floor are 9-over-6 and on the first floor they are 9-over-9. The gambrel roof has an unusual jerkinhead on the south gable.

This section has no stair of its own but can be reached on both levels from the main stair.

A small one and one-half story structure on the north side of the central section may be the oldest part of the house. The walls are thick, at least partially built of log. The ceilings are low.

The present kitchen is connected by several sheds and breezeways to the main house.

"Tudor" was acquired by the Seal Family from William Hall III in the 1940's. The Halls had lived in the house for over a century.

In the 1920's and 1930's "Tudor" was a summer boarding house for families from the city.

The grounds still show some of their former elegance though the property has been neglected for many years. The lawns are terraced, some boxwood and several large trees including a magnificent hemlock remain.
