DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Walke Tenant House is located on the South side of Friendship Rd. at the intersection of Old Solomons Island Rd.

The structure is a two story, 5 bay x 1 bay , frame dwelling (sided with asphalt shingles) on a low brick foundation. Presently in very shabby condition, the house was built c. 1825 and used as a Methodist parsonage, post office and store. A one story kitchen joins the rear. The west side of the main section has been enlarged, and the fenestration on the front is irregular. The main entrance appears to be in the center bay, north elevation; the four panel door has a two light transom above it. The east bay also contained a door. Windows on the front contain 6/6 light sash . There is a wide space between the second story windows on the east side of the front elevation. The main section has a gable roof with the ridge running east to west, a molded box cornice, and a large weathered exterior chimney on the east elevation, which is free standing above the second story. In addition, a narrow exterior stack is at the west elevation. The roof on the kitchen is perpendicular to the main block , and a small inside chimney is on the south end. Both roofs are covered with asbestos shingles.

Interior: The surveyor was told by the owner that the basement had log joists in the ceiling, and that there was at one time a large cooking fireplace with a mantel on the east wall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This plain two story frame house with a a gable roof and large exterior chimney was built c. 1825. Believed to be one of,if not,the oldest dwelling in Frienship, it was used as the parsonage of the Frienship Methodist Church (founded c. 1785), which stood directly east of it. The dwelling stands on land that was owned by an early landowner, a wheelwright, named Sutton.

It has had several additions and the whole is covered with asphalt shingle.</p> <p>The building was a post office in the 1830's and according to local accounts was used to hide confederate soldiers during the Civil War.</p> <p>The house appears on the 1878 map of the county as belonging to a member of the Owings family.</p>
