DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house at Old Colony Cove Farm is a two-part, frame structure situated on a high bluff above Herring Bay. The main part of the house is a 2-story block with a square plan under a flat, hipped roof. The floor plan of this section follows the traditional side-hall, double-parlor arrangement with the hall running east to west. There is a full, brick basement under the east end of the hall and the east parlor, or dining room. There is a large, interior brick chimney at the north end of each parlor. The 1 1/2 story, A-roofed kitchen is attached directly to the north side of the main house. Its large exterior chimney was removed in 1965. Otherwise, little has been altered about either of the two sections of the house.

The exterior of both sections is sheathed in horizontal wood siding. The main house has a metal roof with a small octagonal cupola at the center. The cupola has four 2-pane windows. It is topped with a short finial and there are scroll-cut brackets beneath the eaves.

The eaves of the main roof have a similar bracket treatment. The entrance to the house, on the west side, has an elaborate wooden porch, supported by four plain, round columns. Each side is enclosed with a railing and has a low bench. The roof of the porch has a slight overhang decorated with closely-spaced scroll cut brackets. The front door is double. It is framed by two columns and diamond-pane transom and side lights. The east and west sides of the house have three bays each. The windows have large panes (6/6), with shutters. The south side has a large 3-part window in the middle of the first floor. This lights the stair and the hall. The center of the three parts is a standard 6/6 double-hung sash. The side parts are narrow, have a diamond-pane sash and are shuttered. The whole window is covered by a bracketed architrave with a slight overhang. There are two 6/6 pane windows and one 4/4 pane window on the second floor of the south side. The east side of the house has a wide screened porch covering the length of the first floor. It is probably a 20th century addition.

The interior of the main house is in excellent condition. The floors and moldings are original. A chair-rail surrounds the two main rooms. The mantels are wooden, heavily molded and chamfered in the Victorian manner. The door and window moldings are typical of the 19th century with square corner blocks and roundels.

The kitchen wing at "Old Colony Cove Farm" is a single room with a small pantry. The loft is reached by a narrow, winding stair at the

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Old Colony Cove Farm House has been restored and is maintained in excellent conditon. The careful details and construction make it a fine example of a mid - 19th century house in transition. The floor plan is typical of the area in the 1st half of the 19th century, the cupola, hipped roof and cornice brackets are Victorian in character and are not often seen in the southern part of Anne Arundel County.

According to the owner, the house was built in 1849. It appears on the 1860 and 1878 county maps as owned by Sam Scrivener and E. Sandbury respectively.

north end of the room. The stair is enclosed in vertical beaded panels. The door is battened and wooden latch. The hearth, also at the north end of the room, was covered when the chimney was removed.

There are two 6/6 pane windows with a door between them on either side of the kitchen. Over the openings on the west side there is a small porch with railings.
