DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Built between 1860 and 1878 Lancaster Hill is a simple two story white, frame house. Its name is modern but is derived from the name of a small 19th century community at the crossing of Owensville-Sudley and Sudley Roads. Known as Lancaster, the community supported two stores, a blacksmith, a mill, a church and the Sudley Post Office (see 1860 Martenet map and 1878 Hopkins map). This house is not marked on the 1860 map but does appear on the 1878 map as owned by J. Glover.

The structure faces East. The front section has a center hall and stair with one room on either side. There is an inside chimney at the far end of each room. The interior furnishings are plain; wooden mantels, heavy round stair rail and turned newel post, windows framed in the typical style of fluted moldings, corner blocks and medallions.

The exterior of the front section is sheathed in plain board siding. The roof is metal. The east elevation has three bays. The center bay contains the front door, framed by side and transom lights and is topped by a raised gable at the attic level. The window in the peak of the gable has an ornate pseudo-gothic sash. The second floor windows consist of pairs of 4/4 pane sashes. The first floor front windows and all of the rest of the windows in the house have 6/6 pane sashes. All of the windows have shutters. The front elevation of the house is covered by a one story open porch with a flat hipped metal roof and simple railing. The porch columns are set in pairs across the front. They are slender with chamfered corners.

An unusual feature of the roof detailing on this house is the extended eaves and the eaves brackets with their ends decorated with a simple curve. Another unusual and somewhat eccentric detail is the round louvred vent placed near the peak of each end gable, directly against the back of each chimney.

The house has a low, two story, rear wing with a two story shed roof addition, extending from the rear elevation. These contain the pantry and a modern kitchen. There is a single flue inside chimney, rising at the West end of the kitchen.

The house stands on about 2 acres of ground in a yard planted with large magnolias, gum and maple trees.
